St. Joseph Ora Pro Nobis

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The month of March is traditionally devoted to honoring St. Joseph in our prayers and devotions and it is a fitting time for me to address a question that has arisen a few times in the parish. Namely, "Who is the statue in the place where the tabernacle used to be?"

The statue that has come to fill that space is St. Joseph, the foster father of Christ and Patron of the Universal Church. For the last few decades, this impressive piece of woodwork was in the organ gallery and not as prominently displayed. While we'll soon have a small plaque on the statue to clear up any confusion, it bears worth mentioning that St. Joseph is recognizable by his two identifying motifs: the Christ Child and the lily.

Obviously, his connection to the Christ Child needs no explanation.

The lily is a great connection with the Old Testament which shows his connection to the blood of Aaron, the cousin and assistant of Moses. The book of Numbers, specifically chapter 16, tells us that the staffs which Aaron carried as the High Priest of the Israelite nation as they moved through the desert would blossom. St. Joseph was descended from Aaron's line, that of the tribe of Levi so he is often depicted with the lily as a reminder that he comes from the pedigree of those chosen by God to show hope and a bright future to the people of God. As we know, St. Joseph certainly did as much. Let us pray well and use the intercession of this familiar face and memory to draw closer to the God who provides for our needs and hopes.


