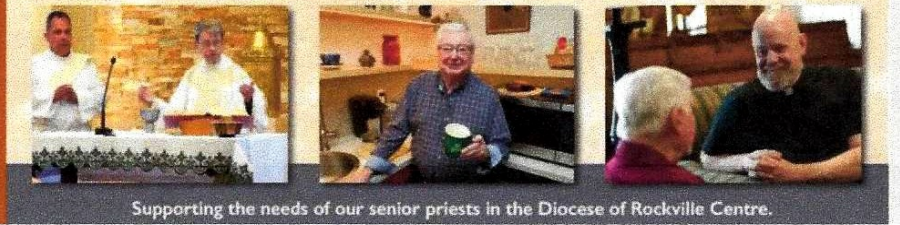

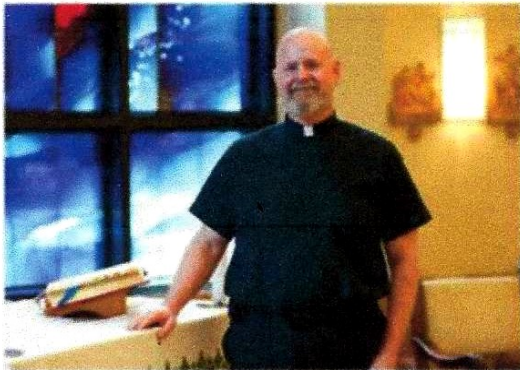


Supporting the needs of our senior priests in the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

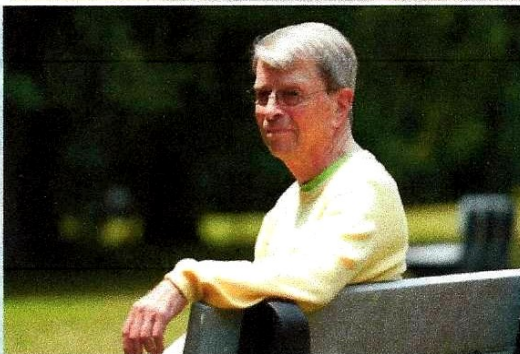
