God has called us through the Gospel to possess the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. -2 Thess. 2,14.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday's Gospel is an incredibly important one for the life of the people of God as the Church since it is Christ's sanctioning of marriage and the basis of our theological understanding of the Sacrament of Matrimony. As we know, there are many levels of intensity when it comes to marriage. It starts with a man and a woman reaching the highest level of commitment after careful discernment, then there is practical planning and organizing for the 'big day,' followed by living a new life with many great differences from what used to be the normal experience of everyday life. St. Augustine reminds us of the exponential importance of a good marriage: "The first natural tie of human society is man and wife." (Good of Marriage, 12.)

Interestingly enough, not only does Christ bless the marriage at Cana with his presence, he also performs his first miracle; this becomes a further demonstration of his favor for a happy, productive, and holy union between his creations who enjoy the depths of the emotion of love which he engenders in the human heart.

One more important element that St. John records is Christ's response to St. Mary's entreaty to help with the shortage of wine: "My hour has not yet come." At the time of St. John, many Christians were wondering when Christ would return, especially since they were facing fierce persecution. Christ urges patience and perseverance in our pursuit of holiness. From the field of Cana to the present day, we have the same commission to commit ourselves to the pursuit of holiness with trust that the Lord will be with us in his good grace. Let us pray well.




