Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On the 22nd of February the Church annually celebrates the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter, commemorating the high authority for teaching and safeguarding of the Faith which was entrusted to St. Peter and his successors as Pope.

At the same time, this Sunday we hear from St. Paul, another powerful teacher of the early Church and a true foundation of the timeless faith that we practice. This Sunday presents us with one of St. Paul's most clear teachings about the heavenly reward of Christian life in one of his most important epistles, the first letter to the church in Corinth.

Pope St. Leo the Great preached well of the two saints who look over us in a distinct way this weekend of the year, saying, “And over this band, dearly-beloved, whom God has set forth for our example in patience and for our confirmation in the Faith, there must be rejoicing everywhere in the commemoration of all the saints, but of these two Fathers' excellence we must rightly make our boast in louder joy, for God's Grace has raised them to so high a place among the members of the Church, that He has set them like the twin light of the eyes in the body, whose Head is Christ. About their merits and virtues, which pass all power of speech, we must not make distinctions, because they were equal in their election, alike in their toils, undivided in their death. But as we have proved for ourselves, and our forefathers maintained, we believe, and are sure that, amid all the toils of this life, we must always be assisted in obtaining God's Mercy by the prayers of special interceders, that we may be raised by the Apostles' merits in proportion as we are weighed down by our own sins.” (*Sermon LXXXII, VII.*)

May we be refreshed by the Sacrament of the Altar and the prayers we make on this holy day so as to be reflective of the spirit of the Apostles.

ARE YOU INTERESTED IN BECOMING A LECTOR FOR MOST HOLY TRINITY PARISH?

Lectors in the Diocese of Rockville Centre, New York must be prepared spiritually, scripturally and practically. They should also be able to convey the meaning of scripture to the the congregation. They should be registered in advanced and receive training from the diocese.

PREPARATION

Spiritual preparation: Pray over the text and reflect on its message.

Scriptural preparation: Understand the text and use the resource books provided by the parish.

Practical preparation: Practice delivering the text aloud, learn pronunciations, and master difficult words.

Immediate preparation: Arrive early, locate readings, and check the sound system.

TRAINING

Register in advance with a letter from your Pastor.

Attend a Lector Workshop, which is available for new and experienced lectors.

In house training will be also be provided after Diocesan training.
